UPCOMING MEETING

Tuesday, 18 October 2011

This month we will again have two speakers and an informative talk on keeping a reptile, yet to be named, but guaranteed to be interesting!

Dr Tom Bergin, veterinary surgeon and ex-Curator of Mammals at Taronga Zoological Gardens, will be speaking from his herpetological experience with a focus on devenomation.

Peri Bolton from the ANU will also be speaking about her research. Peri is reconstructing the evolutionary history of a group of Australian burrowing elapid snakes, primarily distributed over the Australian arid-zone. Peri will use this evolutionary history to examine how climatic and landform changes in the last ~15 million years have created the Australian deserts and influenced the evolution and distribution of these species. She will also discuss the role of diet specialisation in these groups in relation to other elapid groups and its effect on species diversity and characteristics.

Interesting facts

- SVL 300-320mm
- omnivorous, feeding on flowers, fruits, snails, eggs & small vertebrates
- scales are smooth and overlapping, tongue is broad, flat and blue
- gives birth to 7-16 live young in February (late summer)
- found in all habitats throughout estn and nthn Aust. in suburban gardens
- hides under leaves, mulch and rubbish

PROPOSAL FOR ACTHA MEMBER SHIRTS

Our talented student representative, **Angelique Harrison**, has drawn and painted a couple of beautiful images (*see below*) for possible use, along with our logo. The Red-bellied Black Snake was drawn from a photo taken by Ric Longmore and is the front-running image.

The proposal is to have the **Red-bellied Black Snake** and our logo screen printed onto a shirt. Ideas include:


- 1. the use of a good quality T-shirt *or* collared polo shirt, possibly charcoal grey;
- 2. a large image of the Red-bellied Black Snake printed on the back, possibly surrounded by text 'Snakes Alive!', with the ACTHA logo placed on the front pocket;
- 3. a large image of the snake on the front with an equally large ACTHA logo on the back, again with possible 'Snakes Alive!' text;

The shirts will be ordered as a batch, with members purchasing them at cost. At this stage the cost will be anywhere from \$17 to \$28 depending on the shirts chosen and the quantity ordered (the more the cheaper).

The 2012 *Snakes Alive!* Exhibition is fast approaching so we need all members to register their interest asap.
